FROM THE SPIRITUAL DIRECTOR

Ten weeks have passed since the tragedy of September 11. Newspaper editorials, commentators, and everyday people are still asking, "Where was God?". Ever notice that when good things happen no one seems to be asking that question? The answer, of course, is that God is <u>always</u> there, whether good or bad things are happening to us. That simple assertion somehow seems to need fleshing out. What does it mean to say that "God is there"? Recently someone forwarded via e-mail an anonymous piece which made that truth very vivid to me in word pictures. It's entitled "Meet Me in the Stairwell". Some of you may have already seen it. I share it with you:

MEET ME IN THE STAIRWELL

"You say you will never forget where you were when you heard the news on September 11, 2001. Neither will I.

I was on the 110th floor in a smoke filled room with a man who called his wife to say 'Good-by'. I held his finger steady as he dialed. I gave him the peace to say, 'Honey, I am not going to make it, but it's OK. I am ready to go.' I was with his wife when he called as she fed breakfast to their children. I heard her as she tried to understand his words and as she realized he wasn't coming home that night.

I was in the stairwell of the 23rd floor when a woman cried out to me for help. 'I have been knocking on the door of your heart for 50 years!' I said. 'Of course I will show you the way home---only believe on me now.'

I was at the base of the building with the priest ministering to the injured and devastated souls. He heard my voice and answered. I took him home to tend to his flock in heaven.

I was on all four of those planes, in every seat, with every prayer. I was with the crew as they were overtaken. I was in the very hearts of the believers there, comforting and reassuring them that their faith has saved them.

I was in Texas, Kansas, London. I was standing next to you when you heard the terrible news. Did you sense me? I want you to know that I saw every face. I knew every name, though not all know me.

Some met me for the first time on the 86th floor. Some sought me with their last breath. Some couldn't hear me calling to them through the smoke and flames: 'Come to me...this way...take my hand.' Some chose, for the final time, to ignore me. But I was there.

I did not place you in the Tower that day. You may not know why, but I do. However, if you were there in that explosive moment in time, would you have reached for me?

September 11, 2001 was not the end of the journey for you. But someday your journey will end. And I will be there for you as well. Seek me now while I may be found. Then, at any moment, you will know you are 'ready to go'.

I will be in the stairwell of your final moments.

SPANISH CURSILLOS 25 & 26

Now that we just celebrated the Cursillos 25 and 26, I would like to make a few comments regarding them. I have heard the opinion of several cursillistas, who believe that these ones have been the best. I agree based on the following circumstance: First, we had twelve candidates, and *twelve* were the disciples of the Lord.

This special weekend, three candidates traveled from EI Salvador; two of them were ordained ministers and one the clerk of a congregation. They came from abroad as the three Magi of the Christian tradition, who followed the Star of Bethlehem looking for the newborn High Priest and King of kings. These distinguished candidates were assigned to three different tables where they shared their faith, enthusiasm, and particular experiences.

This Cursillo was lived as a unique experience. The face of every candidate reflected gladness and satisfaction while the rollos were delivered. It was the Spirit of God moving the hearts and souls of everybody. These twelve candidates realized what a Cursillo weekend is all about: a real experience with the Creator of Heavens and Earth.

Food and music were also a unique experience. Day by day, hour-by-hour, the kitchen's leader and workers served the candidates with devotion and cordiality. We were like the apostles of a new age seated and eating around the Master and Lord. The cooks offered many palancas, which joined others received from our community and other states, putting in every task their own heart along with their prayers. The food was good, tasty, and healthy, made in a fellowship environment. We were really blessed during the meals.

The last day of the Cursillo, these men of God testified that they had had the most wonderful spiritual experience they could ever imagine. The three candidates of EI Salvador went back to their country with plans to start the Cursillo movement.

I want to thank Mrs. Barbara McBride and all

the members of the Secretariat, who made possible that this Cursillo be successfully accomplished. I also would like to mention that the women's Cursillo 26 was a beautiful experience for the eighteen candidates and the fifty-four worker team who attended it. I want to give special recognition to our new Deacon Manuel Munoz for his participation and sharing of his teaching experience. He was well prepared and always ready for any action and the deliverance of the gospel of our Lord Jesus-

Christ. I am fortunate to have him as my friend.

The rollo room was filled with active participants, the food was great, and the team who prepared it well coordinated. They were very active and willing to do whatever was necessary. The camp area was well covered and clean. The main message during the cursillo was about deliverance. During the closing service, everybody could feel the Spirit of God acting over candidates, workers, and spiritual leaders. Everything was marvelous. I want to thank God for this gratifying spiritual experience.

As we prepare to host the Seminar here in San Diego in 2003, I reflect upon the one just completed at the Camp Allen Conference Center near Houston. In attendance from our Diocese at Camp Allen were John and Anne Wiser and Harry and Ann Packard as well as myself. We each felt the presence of the Holy Spirit throughout our time there and came away refreshed and renewed. At a dinner party the other evening a close Cursillo friend asked me what the purpose of the Seminar was, what did I really get out of it. I told her the education aspects were the most important to me. They broadened my horizons and helped me get a better understanding of the Movement and how it is affecting the lives of people not just in the United States but all over the world. When followed, the Movement brings people to Christ, of that I am absolutely sure. Seminars also show me what not to do, what can go wrong in a Cursillo Community. If we become too focused on Three Day Weekends and neglect Pre-Cursillo and the 4th Day aspects, including Group Reunions, Ultreyas, and the raising up of new leaders, the Movement in our Community will surely die. It's as simple as that! There is one more aspect that I forgot to mention to her. This is that our National By-Laws require periodic plenary sessions where delegates from all Dioceses in good standing need to be able to give voice and vote on any policy changes.

When we host the Seminar in October of 2003. our Fall Cursillo Weekends will not be held so that we all can focus on the Seminar itself. We are in the process of forming a Host Committee right now who will work with our Servant Community in making the necessary early preparations. We hope as many as possible from our Diocese will be able to attend next year's Seminar in Seattle from Thursday 24 October through Sunday 27 October. There the Keynote Address will be by the Rt. CURSILLO is Spanish for short course in Christian living. The 'short course' consists of a Three-day Weekend and a separate "Fourth Day". A team of laity and clergy present the fundamental principles of Christian living through a series of talks and meditations.

Your sponsor believes you have leadership qualities, and have the potential to change your environments for Christ. The weekend is designed to provide leadership training while reaffirming your commitment to the Lord Jesus Christ. After the weekend, there is a continuing program in which you are encouraged to participate.

Since both this weekend and the subsequent involvement are demanding, we ask you to pray seriously about your application before you submit it. Acceptance is not automatic for a specific weekend, but will be prayerfully considered. Once the Pre-Cursillo committee determines the candidate's participation in the upcoming weekend will be beneficial, the candidate will receive notice of acceptance. If your application is accepted, but you are unable to attend the designated weekend, your application will remain active for two upcoming weekends.

In order to gain the most from the weekend, you should be in the best possible spiritual, emotional and physical condition.

Husband and wife should apply at the same time. HUSBAND MAKES CURSILLO FIRST, and the wife makes hers one week later.
