Do You Have a Cursillo Ministry?

The goal of the Cursillo movement is not to create people to work on future Cursillo weekends, but to develop leaders in the Christian community. Of course, we always need cursillistas to conduct the three-day weekends. Cursillistas involved in the movement tend to fall into three general categories:

- There are those who occasionally work a weekend and/or sponsor a candidate.
- There are some who regularly work weekends.
- There are those who have adopted the Cursillo movement as their primary means of apostolic action and work behind the scenes in various capacities.

All three groups serve a vital role in the movement. The third group, however, has an advantage over the other two because it receives regular training on the Cursillo method. The source of that training is the Servant Community, also known as the Leader's School.

What happens at a Servant Community meeting? Well, meetings always begins (after prayer) with a lay and a clergy talk on a fundamental aspect of the Cursillo movement. Regular attendance at Servant Community provides a solid foundational knowledge of Cursillo basics. It is usually followed by a floating group reunion, because wherever two or three cursillistas are gathered together, there will be a grouping. Then we break up into committees that address the various needs of the community. Those committees are as varied as the Cursillo itself. Topics include music, prayer, sponsorship, food, facilities, team training, palanca, parish representatives, computers, and communications just to name a few. The committees are made up of cursillistas who have a ministry in that area. (No one is ever assigned a ministry; everyone chooses their own.) After individual committees meet, we gather together again and report on any developments and recommendations so that we can work together towards common goals. Recommendations are forwarded to the Secretariat who is responsible for policy decisions.

Do you have a ministry in the Cursillo movement? Even if you are just an occasional sponsor or weekend worker, Servant Community can help you to be more effective and give you a voice in

how things work. We meet four times a year on the second Saturday of March, June, September, and December usually at Church of the Good Samaritan in University City from 9 AM to noon. Our next meeting is on June 10th. Hope to see you there. If you have any questions, please feel free to call or email

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Where Is the Trust?

The Diocese of San Diego and its member churches are in a painful place right now. There is a lot of hurt on both sides and in the middle, and if you don't know what I'm talking about, you are a very fortunate person.

Cursillo is a ministry of the Episcopal Church, and it belongs to everyone. The Spiritual Director of Cursillo in San Diego, Father George Calvert, has gone out of his way to keep politics out of the movement, both in the Secretariat and on the Weekends. And yet, I know there are a lot of people who look at the Rector for a weekend, or the Rectora, or the Weekend Spiritual Director, and decide not to sponsor candidates, or decide not to work the weekend, based on the politics of that person. This is happening on both sides of the divide. It shows an alarming amount of distrust, a lack of faith.

I'm sorry to have to tell you this, but the Cursillo movement in this Diocese will wither up and die if we keep thinking and acting this way. We are a community. Many of us have known each other for years through working weekends, and have grown to love and respect each other, and now this element of distrust has entered this close knit community and is eating away at it. Without candidates, we will not have Weekends. Without Weekends, we will lose a valuable teaching ministry in this Diocese, and we will stop building Christian leaders for our churches.

One of the lessons that I have learned in the Episcopal Church is to trust in God. God will watch out for the Cursillo movement, and each and every weekend, and each and every person if we let Him. If we don't, evil can creep into those cracks and tear us apart. Please let's not hold Cursillo hostage to the politics of the Church. We are all on the same side, God's side. Let's keep it that way. Keep Cursillo in your prayers. Send your candidates. Work the Weekends. Keep the faith. He has called you by name.

Palanca

When we think of palanca, we naturally think of the bags filled with letters and little gifts of encouragement we received when we made our Cursillo weekends, or when we work on weekends. These are the tangible evidence that others are thinking of us and praying for us. However, the spiritual palanca in the form of prayer is just as important and cannot be too strongly emphasized. You can pray for the team and candidates at almost any time. If you wish to pray for them by name, check the web site. The teams and candidate list are posted, and updated on a regular basis.

If you are doing "thing" palanca for the weekends, don't forget to get it to Camp Stevens on Thursday night. Please separate your palanca into team and candidate bundles, and if they are named, please alphabetize them by LAST name. The palanca people will thank you.

Palanca parties are a wonderful way for your parish to send a message of love and prayer to the candidates and team to let them know that you are with them in spirit over the weekend.

A Day of Deeper Understanding Saturday, May 20, 2006 St. Timothy's Church 8:30 - 3:00

Because Sunday's message of the Cursillo weekend focuses on providing us with the knowledge and tools to live out our Fourth Day, it is essential that we really understand those Sunday teachings. A lack of understanding of Sunday's message can result in failure to join reunion groups, failure to develop a Rule of Life or to establish a relationship with a Spiritual Director, and poor attendance at Ultreyas.

It is easy to be distracted by the time Sunday rolls around - the intense mental and emotional activity of the weekend, the busy schedule, the anticipation of going home to loved ones. According to the NEC Library, "the purpose of A Day of Deeper Understanding is to take us away from the attitude that Cursillo is only a wonderful weekend experience and toward the understanding of how the gift of the Cursillo Method provides a structure for a lifetime experience of Christian love and service."

The cost of A Day of Deeper Understanding is included in the sponsorship fees paid by the candidates' sponsor for Cursillo attendees. For all others, the cost is \$10.00 per person for materials and lunch.
