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### From the Spiritual Advisor

Why Kids Need to Attend Sunday School

In the 1950's a very high percentage of kids in the United States attended Sunday school or received some form of Biblical education in catholic schools or in synagogue classes. In the 1960's Sunday school attendance started to decline, a decline that has continued to ever lower levels to the present day.

As Sunday school attendance has declined over the last several decades so has the knowledge of the Bible. Many of today's adults who were children after the 1960's seldom if ever attended Sunday school and know almost nothing about the Bible. This lack of Biblical knowledge is a huge development in American society yet it is one of the best kept secrets. No one wants to talk about it. For adults both inside and outside of the church it's embarrassing to admit they do not know about the Bible.

But to know about the Bible is essential if you want to know about God because the Bible is our primary source of knowledge about God. Or to put it another way, it is hard to know about God and His will for your life if you do not know about the Bible because God reveals Himself to us through the words of the Bible.

If a child never goes to Sunday school he or she probably won't learn about the Bible and therefore will not learn about God. The most important thing a child can learn about is God; it is a disaster that so few kids are learning about God. These children are locked into a secular materialist world view without seeing the other dimensions of reality that God wants to show us through the Bible. A child that does not know about the God of the Bible may find him or herself living in the shallow world of materialism and be dominated by popular culture, but missing out on the great spiritual and moral purposes for which God placed us on this earth.

Let's look at some concrete examples, some real life situations. A child's grandparent dies. At a time like this a child starts to wonder if there is more to life than just this material world. Wouldn't it be better that the child was in Sunday school and had learned about heaven and how to get there? If the parent tells a child the grandparent is in heaven and the child has never been in Sunday school the word "heaven" will not have much meaning because they will not have seen how this word is used in the Bible. The word "heaven" will function as a word of emotional comfort, not a bad thing, but convey almost nothing more. But isn't it vitally important that they know more about heaven?

A teenager who has never gone to Sunday school goes to the movie theater with his friends. They watch a very exciting story that glorifies stealing, lying and immoral sexual activity. On the big screen it looks so cool, so sophisticated and like so much fun. The teenager who has never been to Sunday school may have a vague intuitive idea that some of the behavior is wrong, but not a clear idea of what is wrong. In fact, he might start rationalizing, if it's fun and sophisticated perhaps it's not really wrong after all. On the other hand the teenager with a Sunday school education will clearly see what is wrong and why it is wrong. This Biblically grounded teenager will also see the movie as an entertaining story but will have the tools to think about what is wrong with the movie and not take home with him some erroneous ideas.

A person with Biblical knowledge has God's word, which has stood the test of time, with which to compare the fads and erroneous ideas of popular culture. Without this foundation it is all too easy for both teenagers and adults to buy into erroneous thinking that is broadcast over and over again by the news media and the entertainment industry.

Another reason kids should be in Sunday school is that you have to learn about basic Biblical ideas in order to think about God, ideas such as the creation, the fall, the law, the incarnation, atonement, the resurrection, the second coming, and heaven. We need to have knowledge of these ideas if we are going to think theologically. We should not simply believe that God exists; we should be able to think about God for ourselves, and to think about what God is doing in the world and in our lives. But in order to think theologically a person has to have at least a Sunday school level knowledge of the Bible. A person needs to be able to think theologically for him or herself and not just let the clergy do it for them.

I have saved the most important reason kids need to be in Sunday school to last. Learning about the Bible helps give a person what they need to know to make a decision to let Jesus Christ come into their life. A person must hear, really hear, the word of Christ before they can come to faith in Christ.

Paul says in Romans chapter 10, "But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim Him? And how are they to proclaim Him unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!" But not all have obeyed the good news; for Isaiah says "Lord who has believed our message? So faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes through the word of Christ."

Kids as well as adults need to hear the "word of Christ" before they will be able to have faith in Christ and to follow Christ. Sunday school lets kids hear the "word of Christ" at their level, so that faith can start developing, giving them an opportunity to later accept Jesus as their savior.

I believe that kids need to be in Sunday school and I also believe adults should be in Christian education classes and small group Bible studies. We always must be hearing the "word of Christ" if we are going to be followers of Jesus.
