From the Chair

Grace and peace to all of you! This past weekend, I attended an event sponsored by the diocese for those churches that have been broken up. I went for a couple of reasons; one of those reasons was that Cursillo, too, has been broken up along with those churches. The moderator for the weekend was Fr. George Martin of Minnesota, and he referred to these churches as The Church of the Second Chance, a name he took from an Ann Tyler novel. Fr. George Martin talked about the stories we tell about what happened, and suggested that it is time to tell the stories of what is to come. We will have opportunities to do just that coming up in our Cursillo movement. Cursillo can be the Cursillo of the Second Chance.

The Men's and Women's Weekends this spring were very much a rebirth, I thought. We worked with very small teams, but I have never seen happier teams. Everyone got to bed early all three nights on the Women's Weekend, and I hear the Men's was much the same. There were no skits, thus fewer tables to move. The men experienced the miracle of snow, and the women experienced the miracle of summery days, and neither Father George Calvert nor I have heard one complaint about anything that happened on either weekend, which is unusual.

As we move into a new season in our beloved Cursillo movement, I see so much positive energy, even though there have been some very tough and unpopular decisions to make, especially that of excluding non-Episcopalians from working weekends.

And as we move forward into a brighter day, there will be many more good things to follow. In September, there will be an ECLW, where we hope to focus on our vision of who we want to be in the coming years. We are asking the National team to focus on visioning, rather than teaching us about how to run a weekend. The ECLW will be held at St. David's, San Diego, on Sept. 21-23. I hope many of you will want to come help form that vision of where we go from here. This is how we are building that Cursillo of the Second Chance.

The Holy Spirit and You

One of the most important passages in the Bible is Acts Chapter 2, which is about the coming of the Holy Spirit. I ask that you read the entire chapter. Every Christian needs to see how each part of this chapter relates to his or her life, because the Holy Spirit is in the business of transforming lives. Put yourself into the story and interact with the text. What is the Spirit saying to you in each part of Acts 2? There are five sections of Chapter 2. (1) The coming of the spirit. (2) Speaking in tongues. (3) Peter's sermon. (4) What should we do? (5) The life of the first community. Read and reflect on each section. After really engaging with each part of Chapter 2, please say the Cursillo prayer to the Holy Spirit.

"Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful and kindle in us the fire of Your love. Send forth Your Spirit and we shall be created, and You shall renew the face of the earth. O God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy Your consolations; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

I hope if you do the above exercise, you will experience the inner power and presence of the Holy Spirit. God the Holy Spirit wants to get inside of you. May the Spirit breathe into you His life giving breath and give you new life.

ULTREYA!

Ultreya is the cry of encouragement used by Spanish pilgrims on their journeys to a pilgrimage site. It means Onward! Forward! Persevere! In the U.S., it is the call to Cursillistas to come together to help each other on their journeys with the Lord.

An Ultreya Committee has been formed with the purpose of holding at least one ultreya per month in various parts of the diocese. An ultreya is designed to give personal examples of fellow Christians attempting to follow God's call to make a friend, be a friend, and help bring that friend to Christ.

Typically, a potluck, music, grouping, two witnesses, and a clergy scriptural response are parts of an ultreya. No worship service is included.

Since everyone is welcome, this is the perfect time to introduce prospective candidates to Cursillo.

The committee will contact Parish Representatives to schedule an ultreya. Using the resources of the parish, with active support from the Ultreya Committee, we will hold an ultreya, encouraging ALL in the parish community (not just Cursillistas) to participate.

If you'd like to volunteer to hold an ultreya in your parish or to cosponsor one at another church, please also let me know.
