Message from the Chair



I've been a movie buff almost all my life. For a kid like me, eating popcorn at a Saturday matinee was the best part of the whole week. Nowa-

days, as much as I like watching those old nostalgic movies on TV, I still look forward to watching a good action and suspense thriller on the big screen. I recently conducted research on a number of films where the main character experiences the awesome power of God. God skillfully uses the eye of a camera to bring us a glimpse into lives not only ravaged by hatred and rejection, but also lives transformed by the grace of God through faith. I was surprised to discover that the majority of these films, nearly two dozen, were produced during the 1940's and 50's. This was at a time in our history when faith in God and pride in our country was at its highest peak. "Family night" meant getting together to watch a good movie or to play games. Blockbusters such as the 1956 "The Ten Commandments" and the 1959 "Ben Hur" continue to be aired on television especially during the Lenten season. There are some lesser known but equally notable films such as the 1944 "The Keys to the Kingdom" and the 1953 "The Robe". Films about the life of Christ have proven their worth at the box office and their ability to withstand the test of time. Beginning in the early 1960's, however, there appears to be a noticeable decline in movies with religious themes. Only about a dozen or so films were brought to the silver screen during the next 50 years that followed. Scripts that proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, and qualities such as mercy, sacrifice, forgiveness and redemption all seem to have been relegated to the cutting room floor and replaced by the secular need to be politically correct.

Despite this trend, I believe that there are still a few brave souls in the industry who like to leave us clues of God's presence. In "Masters and Commanders", " The Lord's Prayer" is said in its entirety, no fading-out or cutting away. Fourth Day Article From Gary & Dotty Baty

The first time Dotty and I heard about Cursillo, was when some good friends asked if they could sponsor us to go to a three day weekend. We inquired about the weekend and what it entailed and with some trepidation and not knowing what to expect decided to go. This decision I think was one of the best decisions we have made for our Christian growth; for it is written: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." (Romans 15:13)

The three day weekend came and went before we knew it, and all the thoughts and experiences were lost in our minds and emotions. Our best understanding culminated with the Fourth Day, when all the workers, sponsors and new Cursillistas were gathered together to share in a climate of sincerity, trust, and sharing. Remember the words of Christ when the scribe asked? "Which is the first commandment of all? (Mark 12:28) Jesus answered this; "The first of all the commandments is, Hear, O Israel; The Lord our God is one Lord: And thou shall love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment." (Mar 12:30) "And the second is like, namely this, Thou shall love thy neighbor as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these." (Mar 12:31)
