Shortly thereafter, we took a big hit ourselves when we cancelled our fall weekend due to a lack of candidates, and lost our deposit. But just as we were ready to help our brothers and sisters in El Salvador, many of you have stepped forward to help restore our own finances. Those who attended the Grand Ultreya heard a special appeal to recoup that loss, and gave generously on the spot. If you were unable to attend, you can still contribute by sending a donation. Please join me in congratulating our own Father Carlos, who has been elected to the National Cursillo Secretariat! We can expect both help and direction from National as we move forward on our commitments to the Hispanic community.

Father Ed Busch and Mercedes Weber were reelected to fill full terms. Susan Miller is your new Chair. As I pass the reigns over to Susan and step down from the secretariat I am reminded again of how blessed we are to have such a dedicated and talented group of people doing God's work in our diocese.

The Message of Advent: Christ is Coming!

"And now, the First Sunday of Advent tells us nothing else: your redemption is drawing near! It is already knocking at the door; don't you hear it? It is breaking open its way through the rubble and hard rock of your life and heart. It isn't happening quickly, but it is coming. Christ is breaking open His way to you.

"Do you want to be redeemed? That is the one great question Advent puts to us. Does even a vestige of longing burn in us? If not, what do we want from Advent; what do we want from Christmas? A little inner emotion?..

"Lift your heads you army of the afflicted, the humbled, the discouraged, you defeated army with bowed heads. The battle is not lost; the victory is yours. Take courage, be strong. There is no room here for shaking your heads and doubting, because Christ is coming." Dietrich Bonhoeffer

The Latin work adventus means "coming." The season of Advent is a season of preparation, to prepare each of us for the coming of Christ into our lives. This season of coming is when we focus on Christ's redemptive work coming to us. As Bonhoeffer points out, the one great question of Advent is, "Do you want to be redeemed?"

Redemption is being brought back to God from sin and death. Christ comes to us to bring us back to God. Is this what you want? Or, if you are not interested in Redemption, perhaps all you are interested in, as Bonhoeffer says, is "a little inner emotion" at Christmas.

What is important is that you open your heart, to let Christ come to you during this Advent Season. Perhaps you could say some extra prayers, make an Advent wreath, light a candle on the wreath before dinner, and say prayers inviting Christ to come to you. Or, another idea: pray the four collects of Advent in the prayer book (pages 211 and 212) at home, each collect for a separate week. Think about these collects: how do the ideas in these prayers apply to you? Another idea: look in the New Testament for instances where Jesus came into the lives of people. What can you learn from these New Testament accounts of Christ's coming?

Advent is a time when we look back at how Christ came 2,000 years ago; it is also a time for us to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. But, most importantly, it is when we allow Jesus Christ to come to us today.


