Do you Want a Better Relationship with God?

Do the Disciplines of Abstinence and Engagement

"Oh no! Lent is here - my least favorite church season!" You might be saying this to yourself. But rather than focus on what you are going to have to give up, why not focus on building a better relationship with God? I am asking everyone to re-think how you approach Lent. If a better relationship with God is our goal, then let's look at the spiritual disciplines of Abstinence and Engagement with this goal in mind. The Christian philosopher and spiritual writer, Dallas Willard has helped me re-think these two disciplines and is responsible for much of what follows:

Abstinence sounds like a very undesirable thing to do; to abstain means something will be eliminated, a state of deprivation. But, I wonder if we think of the spiritual discipline of abstinence as a period of time in which we withdraw from the world in order to find God in solitude and silence. It would be a life-giving and refreshing experience to become unplugged from our smart phones, computers, TV's, community activities and even from our families. Simply to set aside some time, even a short period of time to be alone with God in prayer can be very refreshing. To try to shut out the voices of our culture and come before God in solitude and silence, to be alone before God, can be a great way to grow in our relationship with God. We need these quiet times to abstain from the world. In the Gospels, Jesus withdrew from the crowds to be alone with His Father. We need to follow His example. This Lent, how do you plan to spend time alone with God?

Lent also needs to be a time of Engagement. We need to engage with God through study and worship. New ideas about God will enable us to think in a new way, to move out of thinking in the same old ways. If our minds think the same thoughts over and over again, we are in a rut; our lives will not change. But if we study the Bible and theology, and find new ways of thinking about God, we can open the door to changing our life for the better.

Our engagement with God needs to be more than putting new ideas in our minds through study. We need to offer ourselves to God through worship. When we worship God, we are lifted into the life and purposes of God. We are transformed; we engage with God's grace, His active favor poured into us. Study may teach us that it is good idea to love God; however, worship is the action of loving God.

I pray that during this Lent, you will look for ways to both Abstain and Engage, so that you will grow in your relationship with God.





Relax, Refocus and Rest in the Lord was the theme of the weekend January 9–11, 2015.


