Hope and the Coming of Christ

Hope is one of the greatest things in the world. Hope for the future is what makes life worth living. Without hope, we would be so depressed we would want to die. Hope is as essential to life as the air we breathe.

Unfortunately in life hope is not as plentiful as air, it is not something that we can take for granted. Life is full of events that can knock the hope right out of us. The loss of a job, divorce, sickness, problems with our children, addictions, and recurring problems can beat us down until discouragement replaces hope. And a state of discouragement can linger on long after the hope-killing events have ended keeping us from taking advantage of the real opportunities that God places before us. 
