FROM THE DIOCESAN CURSILLO SPIRITUAL ADVISOR

What is Spirituality and Why is it So Important?

We have deep intuitive feelings that there must be some harmonic purpose behind our lives and in the universe around us. We sense we are trying to find our place in the universe. We are convinced that our life could not just be an accident. We are aware that we are more than simply a product of random chance. We believe with Viktor Frankl, the Austrian psychiatrist, that there is meaning to our lives. Frankl says, "Man's search for meaning is the primary motivation in his life, and not a secondary rationalization of instinctual drives." We do not live, according to Frankl, simply for instinctual drives for pleasure or power, but for meaning. Human spirituality is our attempt to find meaning in a universe that, on its surface, can appear as nothing more than a meaningless machine. We do not want to be just simply one cog among other cogs in a meaningless machine. To live a meaningless life is not really to live. We must find meaning through some type of spirituality to become a person, to move beyond instinctual drives or the quest for power, or the mere physical causation of the universe. We must transcend these things of the physical world to become fully human—a real person.

It is inevitable that the human search for meaning will lead human beings to form systems of spirituality that will try to explain the meaning of our lives. The history of mythology, religion, and philosophy is full of human attempts to create these systems that make connections, find harmony, and explain meaning. The human attempts to try to explain meaning, while partially true, always contain falsehood that leads us away from God,

the true source of all meaning and spirituality. False human spirituality is not a good thing. It is used as a channel of demonic deception. True spirituality must proceed from the source of life, the creator of life, none other than God himself. God must be the source of meaning. All true spirituality must be based upon God's divine action. The God who reveals himself to us in and through Jesus Christ acts in our lives through the Holy Spirit; God's actions reveal his plan and purpose and, therefore the meaning of our lives. Human mythology, religion, and philosophy do not bring God's actions into our lives. Our culture does not understand that a true spirituality must be based on God's actions. Our culture wants a Walmart of spiritualities that we can choose from. Our culture is very consumerist. Spirituality is a product to be consumed. You prefer one product; I prefer another. In this manner, spirituality is not true or false; it is a matter of what I prefer. It's about my preference, not about God's actions.

Christianity rejects our culture's Walmart of spiritualities. Spirituality is not a product to be consumed but the presence and action of the Holy Spirit. Spirituality is the mysterious and miraculous moving of the Spirit in us and among us. All true spirituality must be the presence and work of the Holy Spirit.

Some Christian definitions of spirituality:

- The whole of human life viewed in terms of a conscious relationship with God, in Jesus Christ through the indwelling Spirit and within the community of believers. Philip Sheldrake.
- Lived experience of God in Christ through the Spirit and reflection on this experience. Barney Calken
 - The art of living with Jesus or the "with God" life. Richard Foster

Looking at the above definitions of Christian spirituality is like looking at different facets of a diamond. Christian spirituality cannot be captured in one simple statement, but "the whole of human life viewed in terms of a conscious relationship with God" tells us a lot. The phrase, 'the "with God" life' is also a beautiful definition because it gets us to the core of what spirituality means. True spirituality must be with God. It must be the Holy Spirit present and working in us.

Let's directly answer the questions:

What is Spirituality?

It is the Holy Spirit giving us the "with God" life, which gives us meaning, helps us make connections, and brings harmony to our lives.
