Virtual Ultreyas Have Become The Norm, for Now

Virtual Ultreyas Continue Unabated

It appears that it will be a while before we can hold a live in-person ultreya again. Meanwhile we have held four virtual ultreyas on Youtube and they continue to reach more people than we have ever reached before. These ultreyas are accessible virtually for ever on the internet.

Since the previous issue of the Forward, we have produced two virtual ultreyas, the one premiering on June 20, 2020, has had a huge impact, as it was cited by the Bishop and was featured on the Diocese's Weekly News cyber magazine. Youtube reports that it has 261 views to date. We recently released the 4th virtual ultreya on July 25, 2020. This ultreya demonstrated that we can produce an ultreya with participants located anywhere. The music was provided by our longtime Cursillista, Laurie Mumford, who now lives in Idaho Falls, Idaho, and the Scriptural Response was given by Fr. Paul Gambling, from St. Paul's in Yuma, Arizona.

The next ultreya will be released in about a month and will also expand our reach as a Cursillo Community to share the love of Christ beyond all boundaries between people.

FROM THE DIOCESE

Public Statement of our Commitment



The Rev. Brenda Sol, rector of St. Andrew's in Encinitas, and other clergy colleagues in our diocese created a statement of our commitment to our baptismal covenant and Jesus' call to us during this time of twin pandemics of COVID-19 and racial injustice. Any church in our diocese is welcome to use this statement, for instance as a clergy-vestry joint statement, or as an ongoing statement in your bulletin.

As part of the Jesus Movement and the Episcopal Diocese of San Diego, we pledge to love our neighbors and protect the most vulnerable among us, remembering our baptismal vows to "strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being." We live these pledges out by actively engaging in dismantling racism. For many of us, this will mean learning more about our racial identity, listening to those who have experienced racial prejudice, speaking out against racism, and showing up alongside those in our community working to change unjust systems in our society. We also live out this pledge at worship during this pandemic, by wearing face-coverings, respecting distancing guidelines, foregoing the common cup and refraining from congregational singing.
