Finding Your Cursillo Niche

Servant Community Committees

3-Day Weekend--Ever wonder what goes into a putting on a Weekend? Be one of those who make it happen! Various 3-Day Weekend Committees are responsible for facilities, supplies, training new team members, making sure each new candidate gets a songbook, Bible and name tag, gathering Palanca from around the world, critiquing and translating the rollos before each weekend, and facilitating the Day of Deeper Understanding.

4th Day--After the Weekend help schedule and acquire venues, speakers, and musicians for local, Grand and virtual Ultreyas. Or coordinate music and musicians, Parish Representatives, promote and facilitate small groups, aka Grouping, or visit parishes in the diocese as part of the Outreach Team.

Communications--If Publicity, Data, or Technology interests you, consider being part of the Communications team. These committees and individuals represent, on one hand the public face of Cursillo, and on the other, the necessary behind-the-scenes work. Some of the positions are: Email Editor; Forward Editor; Social Media; Saints' Roster; Contact Database Maintenance; Webmaster; Historian; Photographer; Prayer Team Coordinator; Hospitality Committee.

Community Partners--Community Partners serves our Spanish-speaking parishes, facilitating and encouraging full participation on Weekends and in the Cursillo Community. Bilingual team members are available during the weekend, and the translation of written materials is an on-going task. Episcopal Cursillo Ministry partners with the ELCA (Lutheran,) whose members attend Cursillo weekends and with KAIROS, a ministry much like Cursillo for those in prison.

Pre-Cursillo--We call it Pre-Cursillo because...This committee collects the candidate applications, organizes the information on a spreadsheet, sends welcome letters to candidates and their sponsors, confirms their attendance and makes table assignments. In addition, those on the committee begin to pray for each candidate long before the official list for Palanca is published.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESAN CURSILLO SPIRITUAL ADVISOR

What Does the Risen Jesus Think of His Church?

Almost all of the New Testament references to Jesus talk about him prior to the existence of His church. It is after Jesus's ascension into heaven that the Holy Spirit comes to found the Church (Acts 2), so it seems that there is a historical disconnection between Jesus and His church. But, in the very important chapters of Revelation 2 and 3 we learn about what Jesus, risen and alive, thinks about His Church. Since we're in the Church, we should know what Jesus thinks about the Church and what He expects us to be doing.

We often think about Jesus as being an absentee landlord, that he has ascended into heaven and left all the work in the church up to us until He returns in his second coming. Revelation Chapters 2 and 3 show us that Jesus is very involved in His Church and He is the one doing most of the work. Furthermore, He is evaluating the work that we're doing in the Church.

In Jesus's parables, such as the parable of the talents in Matthew 25:14-30, Jesus pictures himself as an absentee landlord to stress His teaching that we will someday stand before Him at the end of our time on earth and he will render His final judgement. But in Revelation Jesus is among us rendering His judgement on His Church-Jesus is constantly rendering judgement. His judgement is both positive and negative. He points out to us the good things we are doing as well as the bad. Jesus is also among us, and He knows of each of our problems, and He is at work helping us with our problems. In Revelation Jesus is the all-powerful, ever present, always working landlord. He owns His church, and He is very involved in making sure it is fulfilling its mission.

The churches that John is writing to in 96 A.D. are in the Roman province of Asia, which is modern day Turkey. He is writing to seven churches. There are more churches than seven in that area, but the word "seven" is used as a symbol so that he is writing to the whole church. That means he is also writing to us, since we're part of the whole church. The seven historical churches are (reference: Wikipedia):

- 1) Ephesus (Revelation 2:1-7): known for having labored hard and not fainted, and separating themselves from the wicked; admonished for having forsaken its first love (2:4)
- 2) Smyrna (Revelation 2:8-11): admired for its tribulation and poverty; forecast to suffer persecution (2:10)
- 3) Pergamum (Revelation 2:12-17): located where 'Satan's seat' is; needs to repent of allowing false teachers (2:16)
- 4) Thyatira (Revelation 2:18-29): known for its charity, whose "latter works are greater than the former"; tolerates the teachings of a false prophetess (2:20)
- 5) Sardis (Revelation 3:1-6): admonished for - in contrast to its good reputation - being dead; cautioned to fortify itself and return to God through repentance (3:2-3)
- 6) Philadelphia (Revelation 3:7-13): known as steadfast in faith, keeping God's word and enduring patiently (3:10)
- 7) Laodicea, near Denizli (see Laodicean Church) (Revelation 3:14-22): called lukewarm and insipid (3:16)

In Jesus's comments on the seven churches, there are several characteristics that serve as marks of the true church. The true church loves Jesus with the fervor of a newborn convert. The true church is filled the living presence of the Holy Spirit. The true church has people that are becoming more and more holy. In other words, the true church is filled with holiness. The true church rejects false teaching and has the gumption to stand up to false teachers. In other words, the true church continues the teaching of the apostles and is therefore orthodox in its theology. Finally, the church is functioning as a lampstand holding up the light of Christ to the world. Jesus is the light of the world, and the church is a lampstand that enables Jesus's light to shine in the world.

We can sum up by saying that the risen life and light of Christ is alive and working in His church. It is our job to not block, but to cooperate with Jesus, the all-powerful, all-present, doing most of the work, landlord of His Church.

A MESSAGE FROM THE CURSILLO #146 RECTORA

Cursillo Weekend #146 is just around the corner! Please pray that God will truly be present to the Team and to the Candidates.

Each Cursillo Weekend encounters unique challenges within the general format. Such as, a visitation of bees to the Rollo Room. Everyone moved to a new, cosy location. On another Weekend, the Team arrived just after 4 or 6 inches of snow arrived. Yet on another weekend, one Rectora managed to find sleeping locations for her Team because a wildfire had destroyed the usual housing buildings. Then there was the move from the familiar Camp Stevens to the unfamiliar Pine Valley Bible Conference Center. Many adjustments were required.

Perhaps dealing with different situations is some sort of Cursillo tradition.

So far, the Cursillo #146 Team has responded to two such situations. First, the Covid-19 protocols prior to and during Camp have been addressed. Second, the Pine Valley Camp will preview its Christmas Light Show on Saturday night, October 30, for some state and local officials.

In response to the Covid-19, the #146 Team, prior to entering Camp, will ask each Team member and each Candidate the usual Covid health questions, required by Pine Valley Camp. The Camp requires masks for everyone only while walking in the dining hall. Masks are Not required while sitting at the group designated tables. For our Cursillo group, people need to mask only if they are unvaccinated and in close proximity to others. Anyone who feels more comfortable wearing a mask may do so, of course. There will be hand sanitizer available in the Rollo room, and at the tables in Worthington, and in Fireside.

If you plan to come to Open Clausura on Sunday, please bring and wear a mask, just as we do in our parish churches.

In response to Pine Valley Camp's Christmas Light Show prevue, the Cursillo Team will prepare the Eucharist and the following Agape

Dinner in Worthington Hall. Rather like the tradition at Camp Stevens, but, Cursillistas and professional caterers, Tim and Linda Lyons will cater the Agape Dinner. It's rather involved as there are no kitchen facilities at Worthington. However, aided by Craig Noble and Sunny Landry, and their team, Worthington will become a Bistro for a lovely celebration of Christ's resurrection!

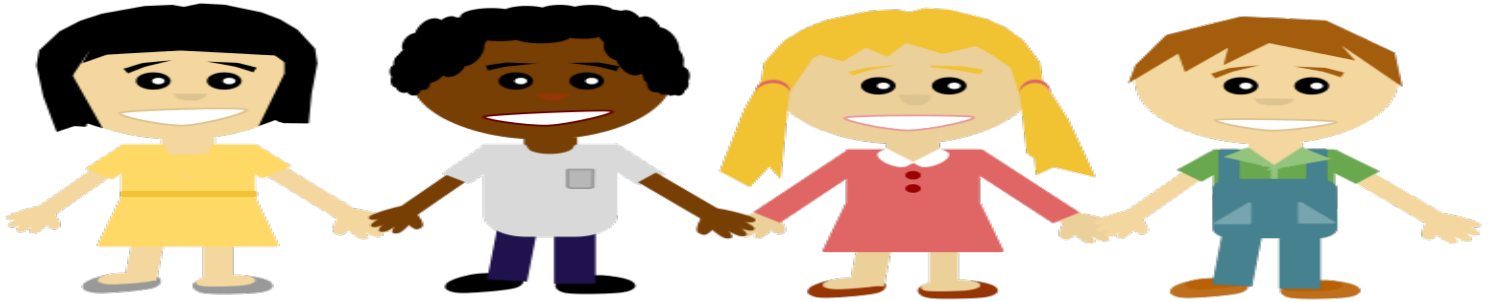

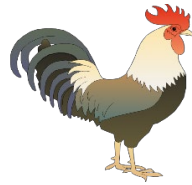
