MESSAGE FROM THE DIOCESAN CURSILLO SPIRITUAL ADVISOR

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR

WHAT IS IT? HOW DOES IT WORK? WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

THE CHRISTIAN LITURGICAL YEAR BEGINS FOUR SUNDAYS BEFORE CHRISTMAS. THESE FOUR SUNDAYS ARE THE SEASON OF ADVENT AND THEY ARE THE BEGINNING OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR. EVERY YEAR THE CHURCH EXPLORES AND LIVES INTO THE GREAT THEMES OF CHRISTIANITY IN ITS WORSHIP SERVICES.

1. What is the Liturgical Calendar?

The Liturgical Calendar is a one-year cycle beginning in Advent and ending with the Feast of Christ the King at the end of November. This calendar designates particular themes to our worship. All churches prior to the Reformation used the Liturgical Calendar to allow for their worship services to be filled with a large selection of Christian content. Over the course of a year the major themes of the Bible and creeds were woven into the worship services. The worship services and the content are organized by the liturgical calendar so that the whole story of Salvation is told over the course of a year.

- 2. How does the calendar work? It is organized around the two greatest Christian holidays: Christmas and Easter. Of the two, Easter is the greatest Christian holiday because Easter is about the Resurrection, the central act of Salvation. In fact, resurrection is salvation; to be resurrected is to be saved. Christmas celebrates the Incarnation, that God has come to us in a person—Jesus of Nazareth. And because Jesus is God among us, He is the ultimate revelation of God. With the foci of Christmas and Easter, the calendar is organized around a nativity cycle and a resurrection cycle. Each cycle has a preparatory season, a content season, and a consequential season. For example, the Nativity cycle has Advent as the preparatory period, Christmas as the content season, God becoming incarnate in Jesus, and the consequence season is the Epiphany, the revelation or manifestation of the incarnation out into the world. The Three Wisemen story is the prime example of Jesus being revealed to the world. The Resurrection cycle has Lent as the preparatory season, Easter as the content season, and Pentecost as the consequential season. Pentecost is when the Holy Spirit comes and pours out into the world the risen life of Christ.
- 3. Why is the liturgical calendar important? The liturgical calendar transfers the Bible's story of Salvation into the church. Every year we relearn this story and so go deeper into it. We pray, study and act upon and become part of the story. This Advent we have begun a new church year, but perhaps now that you know about the two liturgical cycles you can start thinking and praying about the Nativity cycle and how Advent, Christmas and Epiphany seasons all fit together. How does looking forward to the coming of Jesus in Advent fit together with the Incarnation at Christmas and the manifestation or revelation of the incarnation at Epiphany?

We need to think, pray, and live into the Nativity cycle in the coming weeks. How is Jesus coming to us? How is the fact that God has come to us in Jesus changing our life today? How is God using you to manifest or reveal Jesus to others?

Just when you thought that "Brown Bag" Ultreyas may be catching on Fr. Carlos says "NO! My cocineros and I will cook a hot and delicious dinner for everyone! Come to St. Phillip's on Friday night and we will have a Grand Ultreya!"

On Friday night, November 20, 2021, only six days after the Day of Deep Understanding, another "live" Ultreya was held and this one was indeed grand. A hot pozole was the bill of fare that provided us with food that nourished our bodies, while prayer, music, Grouping, excellent witness talks and an engaging scriptural response provided us with spiritual food that enlightened our souls.

Rachel Ambasing gave an inspiring Witness Talk of how she answered the call to act for Jesus and lead the flock at St. Matthew's as a lay leader in a staff position. This action required her to let go of the self-centeredness of her fear and embrace the peace and power of trust in the Lord. Her talk flowed freely from the heart.

Jeanna Timan's Echo was also delivered from the heart. This was Jeanna's first Ultreya witness talk, but it evinced the freedom of expression that is only possible when an otherwise severely shy person completely places her trust in Jesus.

The power of Jesus' love permeated the entire room. All those things that first appeared as obstacles to Jeanna's ability to taking a leadership role in what had been her mother's ministry, just melted away. Jeanna became the leader whom Jesus needed to lead the ministry.

The Ultreya talks demonstrated how two young Christians can grow to become leaders in the ministries of God through the Cursillo Method and by trusting in Jesus in answering His call.

There were 44 Cursillistas who signed in. Three new lay Secretariat Members were elected by acclamation: Debbie Kistler, Jill Mora, and Giovanni Nunez. Four Secretariat members were termed out with thanks and blessings: Judy Brown, Susan Miller, Mike Jewett, and Ruben Rodriguez.

All were thrilled by the Announcement that Michael Jewett is the Rector of the next Spring Cursillo Weekend #147, April 28-May 1, 2022!

May all of you have a blessed Advent and a healthy year ahead.


