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## ***A MESSAGE FROM THE CURSILLO SPIRITUAL ADVISOR***

### ***What Should I Say to My Friend Who is Not Going to Church?***

Nowadays most people do not attend church. They might see the church as boring, irrelevant, unnecessary, a waste of time; in other words, they see no value in church attendance. Still other people may not just see the church as something of no value but as an activity that is detrimental; they may even feel hostile toward the church. Perhaps they had a bad experience and have concluded everyone in the church is a hypocrite. We who attend church need to have an answer to those that might ask us, “Why do you attend church?” We need to be able to explain in terms they can understand why we find value in being in church. What makes it worthwhile to someone to block out time on a Sunday and spend time in church worshipping?

Before we answer these questions, we need to realize that people outside the church may be coming from a different world view than what we understand. A person today may come from a secular materialist point of view that believes what is real is what is seen or touched or has monetary value, that spiritual things are merely opinions and are not real, that the non-material aspects of the church

are not real. When a materialist attends church, the inward spiritual treasure is not seen.

Still others may hold a pantheistic world view that the universe is God and that there is no distinction between the creator and the creation. We should note that both the materialist and the pantheist worship the creation rather than the creator. Oftentimes people who have been reading about new age religions have a pantheistic world view. For them God is part of them because they are part of the universe, and the universe is God. They see themselves as automatically being a “spiritual person” because the universe god is already in them. They think there is no need to attend a church to develop a relationship with God; they think they are God. For pantheists, spirituality is about getting in touch with themselves. This turning of oneself into God is idolatry and therefore a false religion.

So, depending on what world view the person is coming from, they may judge the church as being a worthless institution or of not enough value to attend. They do not understand how important it is to worship the creator and know of his will. God has created them and has a plan for their life.

We also must be aware that people may be convinced that they find community and support for their lives through other means and therefore the church is unnecessary. I believe for many people today the internet and TV has become their church. Social media and television guide their views and provide them with a frame of reference of how to interpret the world. Depending on which platform one reads, a different interpretation will develop. These different interpretations divide people into tribes based on politics, race, gender, and class in order to fight other tribes. Identity politics assign people an identity other than the one given to them by their creator--being in the image of God. The media’s goal is to make the assigned identity the ultimate category for making decisions. But the truth is every person is created in the image of God and is of great value in the eyes of God. The image of God should be the ultimate category through which we look at other people. The ultimate image of God in a person on earth is Jesus Christ. All other images of God are to some extent distorted by sin. We should be clear that what seems like a community on the internet or television is most often done as a way of trying to divide people and even in some cases cause people to hate other people. What seems like a community may not exist. The illusion of community and support on the internet and TV may just be a way of mobilizing people to get them to do things they wouldn’t otherwise do.



## **So, why do I attend church? Here are some possible answers:**

The church is the community of Jesus Christ on earth and reflects the ultimate image of God in Christ to the world, even through the imperfect people in church.

Jesus Christ is present and active in the church. Jesus Christ is the subject of the church, and it is He who makes attending church of great value. The church, by itself, is not of great value. It is Jesus Christ's presence and light in the church that gives it its value. The church is full of sinful people, but it is also full of the loving presence of Jesus Christ. It is the loving presence of Jesus that gives the church its great value. It is Jesus himself among us loving us and teaching us God's wisdom that makes the community of Christ of supreme value.

Church is not just opinions about God, but church is about experiencing the presence of God and his grace working in the church and in you personally.

In the church we learn about the two great commandments; "the first commandment is this: Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God is the only Lord. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: Love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." "On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." It is a lifelong process of learning how to live out these commandments and we need the church to help us to obey these commandments. It is in obeying the first commandment of loving God that enables us to implement the second commandment of loving our neighbor. It is agape love, the unconditional love of God that we experience and learn about in the church.

Attending church is about being converted by Christ into a new life.

Attending church is about faith, hope, love, and forgiveness.

Attending church is about preparing yourself to meet God after you die.

Attending church is about experiencing the miraculous intervention of God in unexpected ways—it's about God's wonderful surprises.

Attending church is about being honest with yourself and holding yourself accountable.

In the church we have the opportunity to experience new life in Christ here on earth and be prepared for everlasting life in heaven.

In the church we experience a window into heaven and see ourselves from the standpoint of eternity.

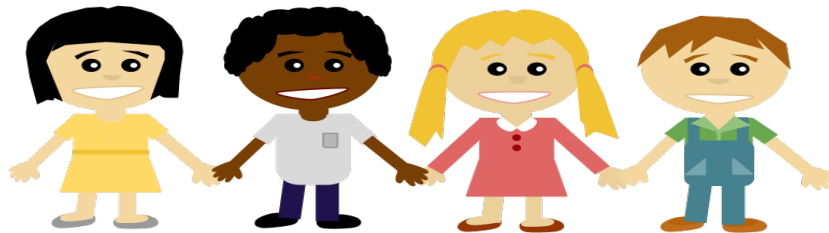

## ***CURSILLO FOURTH DAY FIRST***

### *Jesus Blows Away The Blues At Good Shepherd Ultreya!*

Recall that the disciples “devoted themselves to the Apostles’ teaching and fellowship, the breaking of the bread and the prayers.” (Acts 2:42) “Day by day they broke bread, ...and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people.” (Acts 2: 46-47a)

The Holy Spirit was present at the Friday Night Ultreya at Good Shepherd on September 9, 2022. “It was the best Ultreya experience I ever had.” exclaimed cursillista Nancy Calvert. Seventeen cursillistas and a guest gathered for prayers, fellowship and a delicious potluck, uplifting music, a group reunion, and witness talks.

Bruce Potocki shared how he was led by his cursillo experience to seminary, his discernment process, and to his ministry as a lay pastoral care minister in the Lutheran Church. There is a great need for the pastoral care ministry, especially in providing a loving ear of listening to lonely parishioners who cannot come to church for worship and fellowship. He found that listening leads to healing and relief for these people. It is also rewarding to the listeners as they see these people relax and smile. He found it was especially appreciated for him to bring previously consecrated communion to these parishioners. Bruce commended the Episcopal Church for its training of Lay Eucharistic Ministers.

Ruth Sutehall’s Echo Talk showed how gardening can lead to a fruitful ministry for sharing God’s love with friends and neighbors. Simple acts of sharing her garden’s bounty with friends and neighbors is encouraging and uplifting to their spirits. Ruth also echoed Bruce’s points about pastoral care as she is part of the Pastoral Care Committee at Good Shepherd.

Fr. George’s Scriptural Response tied the Witness and Echo Talks together as both speakers showed that they used their God-given gifts to meet the needs of others to the glory of God.

The Cursillo Musical Saints consisting of Fr. Peter Sickels, Bart Newsom, Duane Chevalier, and Ruben Rodriguez prepared the way to the excellent witness talks by raising the house with their rendition of Jesus is the Rock! Now we are looking forward to the next ultreya to be held in mid-day on Saturday October 8, 2022.

## ***WITNESS TALK***

### *Piety, Study And Action In 30 Minutes A Day*

The title is tongue in cheek, of course, but I want to share a simple activity, which reminds me of the widening circles of ripples created when a stone is tossed in the water. This action has impacted my life and the lives of others beyond my normal sphere of influence.

About 2 years ago, I joined my dad, Ted, and Paula, one of my sisters, in reading through the Bible. My dad is 92 and since his eyesight had deteriorated to the point he could no longer read; we took turns reading to him. Every day except Sunday we have a conference call where we read through a few chapters of the Bible. So far, we've read the entire New Testament at least once, the gospels several times, and almost all the Old Testament. At first, we were following a schedule published by their church, but after a while we set our own pace. On Saturdays, we take a break from the routine and read a couple of chapters from Proverbs.

Paula cooks breakfast on Friday morning for our dad, at her place. Instead of our usual daily call at 4 pm, they sit and read at the kitchen table together after breakfast. They put everyone on speaker and call me so I can participate. After the usual jokes are out of the way, about whether I'm out of bed yet, we read.

Along the way we added one more person to our reading group. Dave is a retired Los Angeles police detective in his 80's, who moved to Colorado to be with his daughter. He and Ted became friends, but whenever the subject of God would come up, Dave showed no interest in going to church or in his spiritual life at all. His excuse was always, "I don't want to go to heaven because my ex-wife might be there." He said it jokingly, but you could tell there was some real hurt behind his words.

Somewhere along the line, my dad invited Dave to join him for breakfast at Paula's house. Dave was less than enthusiastic about reading the Bible, but he was happy to drive my dad to Paula's and he loves a good breakfast. The first few times he sat in the other room after breakfast while the Bible was being read, but soon became intrigued and stayed at the table.

In the process of hearing the Word of God, Dave became a different person. The change in him was no less sudden or dramatic than flipping on the lights in a dark room. He loves reading the Bible now and has become an unabashed follower of Jesus. No matter how many chapters we read each day he always wants to read another. "It's just a short one!" he'll say. He calls my dad every morning to read aloud a daily devotion by Dr. Jeremiah. At a different gathering of my dad's friends, a regular Wednesday breakfast at a restaurant,



Dave piped up, "Anyone mind if I read today's devotional?" The first time he read it at breakfast, it was well received, in fact, someone else suggested, "Maybe we should do a Bible Study, too." Dave found a church, talked to the pastor extensively, went through membership classes, and attends faithfully. He invites and encourages everyone he meets to go to church. He reads the Bible to people at the retirement home where he now lives and even got the activities director onboard. He has a weekly lesson from a woman there who was a Bible teacher by profession. He sometimes brings urgent prayer requests to our daily reading time.

While the image of a pebble thrown into a placid lake may describe the action of our daily Bible reading, in Dave's case, he is making his own ripples. In fact, the image that comes to my mind is not a stone thrown into the water, but of a person on a diving board yelling, "Cannonball!"

This routine of daily out-loud Bible reading with others has turned out for me to be the 3-legged stool of the Cursillo Method. We just finished Revelation, where I considered the letters to the churches, wondered about the meaning of the scrolls, seals, angels, bowls, and plagues, and was awed by the imagery and descriptions of final judgment, the New Jerusalem, and especially, the Lamb. We're reading Deuteronomy now. It recounts the giving of the 10 commandments, and the care of God for his people during 40 years of wandering. I'm amazed to see how often Jesus quoted from this book and how words so ancient are so timely. Just a simple thing as reading to someone daily from the Bible has been an enriching experience.

Comparing my life to the Scripture we read, talking to Jesus about my shortcomings and sins, and seeking His direction for my life, has deepened my relationship with God, in other words, **Piety**. Reading the daily chapters leads to questions that lead to more reading, more questions, research, and reflection which amounts to **Study**. Continuing to read to others has become **Action**.

Just like a pebble thrown in the water sends concentric circles that get larger and larger, the simple activity of reading the Bible out loud every day has rippled out in wide circles and touched more people than I could ever have imagined reaching on my own. The Holy Spirit acting through reading the Word of God, and changing lives; friends, friends of friends, children of friends, and parents of friends, has been an awesome thing to witness.

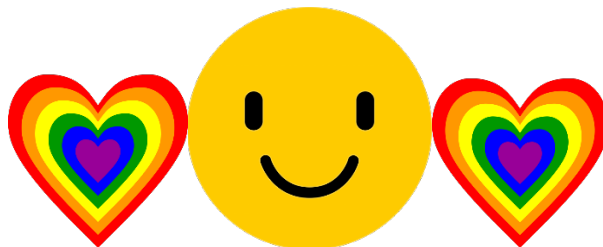
